

Everything Changes

Change. Adaptation. Like it or not, our lives are filled with it. Sometimes it's slow and gradual—a series of incremental changes that are barely noticeable until years down the road one looks back and sees what happened. I think that's the way it is most of the time. I think every day there are little things that happen that slightly alter our lives and we adapt naturally and without thinking that we aren't even aware that things have changed. So we go on to the next day thinking everything is normal and nothing really changes. That's the way it is usually.

Then, there come those moments, those single events that are so dramatic that everything changes in an instant; not the slow, incremental, barely noticeable changes that add up over the course of many years, but the solitary occurrences that rock your world. Gabriel visits Mary with the news that she will bear a son who has been expected for generations and generations. Everything changes. 


